Milk If you would like your current Reception child to continue to have milk in school when they reach the age of 5, please visit www.coolmilk.com to order and pay for milk. If you have any questions please speak to Mrs Gilliam in the School Office. If your child is **under 5** we will register your child on your behalf as they are entitled to free milk.

sQuid Payment System Our school continues to operate as a no cash environment, and we use a payment system called sQuid. Children new to the school will receive details in due course for parents to set up a sQuid account. Each child has an individual one, newbies can't be added to a sibling's account. sQuid is currently used for everything such as trips, swimming, production tickets, pre-loved uniform, and charity donations. We also set up sQuid with instalment schemes to


