Dear Parents

Our Summer Term topic this year is 'At the Seaside'. This letter provides an outline of the main areas of learning the children will experience during the term. We hope that you will find it interesting and that it will be a useful starting point for supporting your child in their learning. Please ask your child's class-teacher if you have any questions.

We will be launching our topic with a visit from an educational Punch and Judy show, enabling the children to explore key aspects of seaside holidays from the past. We also hope to have a visit from the RNLI to teach us how to keep safe when we visit the beach. The author Cathy Watts will also be coming in to entertain us with the Sandies, the little folk who live under the beach huts in Hove! To continue the excitement, we will be welcoming the Rainbow Theatre with their production of The Jolly Roger Show and on this day, we will be having a Pirate Day and will be asking the children to come to school dressed as pirates (date to be confirmed). We are also hoping to visit Brighton for a day to take part in a range of exciting activities including visiting the Volks Railway and the Palace Pier where we will ride the carousel. We will also be going to Hove Lagoon and visiting Cathy Watts' beach hut.

At the end of term, we will be having a Seaside Day as a finale for the topic where we will re-enact historical seaside activities!

There will be a cost per child for our visit and visitors into school, this will be sent out in a separate letter as soon as all booking arrangements have been confirmed. Unfortunately, not all activities will take place unless we receive enough contributions towards them.

The Summer Term is also a very busy term in school with lots of other activities going on as well, including Sports' Day, the FUBS Summer Fair and transition mornings.

Children should continue to wear suitable PE kit on their PE days, these are the same as last term. A reminder that if your child wears earring studs or small sleepers, they should either be removed on PE days or covered with micropore tape provided by yourself. We also ask that no other jewellery should be worn at school.

As the weather gets warmer, please ensure that your child has a named sun hat every day and that sun cream is applied in the morning before school. Children can also have sun cream labelled with their names in their bags, but they will be required to apply it themselves.
