**sQuid Payment System** Our school continues to operate as a no cash environment, and we use a payment system called sQuid. Children new to the school receive details for parents to set up a sQuid account. Each child has an individual one, newbies can't be added to a sibling's account. sQuid is currently used for everything such as trips, swimming, production tickets, preloved uniform, and charity donations. We also set up sQuid with instalment schemes to help you budget with school expenses, as we appreciate sometimes everything seems to come at once..............
